CHECK-IN PROCEDURES FOR COACHES/MANAGERS AND PLAYERS

- *Team manager/coach must check in with the OBHF Representative/Arena Captain before each game.
- *Team manager/coach is responsible for completing the electronic game sheet at a minimum of 20 minutes prior to every game.
- *All players must check in with the OBHF Representative/Arena Captain to register prior to the player's first game.
- *Coaches must provide weekend contact phone number and reliable email address to OBHF Representative/Arena Captain

ALL PLAYERS MUST BRING <u>PHOTO</u> IDENTIFICATION AND PROOF OF AGE (DIGITAL COPIES ACCEPTED) TO THE EVENT IN ORDER TO REGISTER. NO EXCEPTIONS!!!

*Once registered with the OBHF Representative/Arena Captain, each player will receive a wristband that must remain on for the duration of the event.

ROSTER

OBHF allows teams to register 22 players of which two (2) must be goalies. Only 18 players and 2 goalies may dress in a game. Teams may **NOT** dress 19 players and 1 goalie!!

The "Team Roster Form" on Page 11 must be completed by all teams. It <u>MUST</u> be provided to Lino at lino@ontarioballhockeyfederation.ca by <u>Friday</u>, <u>June 27</u>, <u>2025 at midnight!!</u>

AFFILIATE PLAYER S (APs)

Teams are allowed to AP (affiliate player) up to 4 players from within their league, provided the players are from the division immediately below and not scheduled to play on the same weekend.

The "Team Pickup Form" on Page 12 <u>MUST</u> be provided to Lino at lino@ontarioballhockeyfederation.ca by <u>Friday</u>, <u>June 27</u>, <u>2025</u> at <u>midnight!!</u>

PLAYER ELIGIBILITY

Players are required to register and play in one (1) preliminary/round robin game to be eligible for elimination, quarter-final, semi-final or final games.

A player may only participate with one team, in one division, in the tournament.

Any player serving an <u>OBHF multi-game</u> which would carry into the Provincial event, <u>MUST</u> serve all remaining games with the player's original team prior to participating.

WARM UP & GAME LENGTH

- *Three (3)-minute warmup.
- *Games will be three (3) 10-minute stop time periods.
- *There will be no overtime in preliminary/round robin play; however, a shoot out will occur (See "Shoot Out for Preliminary/Round Robin Games")

POINTS ALLOCATION

Three (3) points will be awarded to the game winning team following the regular game time, zero (0) points to the losing team and one (1) point to each team in the event of a tied game following regular game time.

SHOOT OUT for PRELIMINARY/ROUND ROBIN GAMES

If game is tied at end of regulation, a 3-player shoot out will occur. Teams **DO NOT** change ends.

The "home" team designated on the game sheet will have the option to shoot first or second.

A player serving a penalty following the three (3) periods will be deemed ineligible for the shoot out and must remain in the penalty box.

If still tied following the 3-player shoot out, the shoot out will continue one player at a time until a winner is declared.

Teams must exhaust their roster before a player may shoot a 2nd time. Once a team has exhausted their full roster, the other team may commence shooting a 2nd time thereby not having all players participate in the shoot out,

The winning team will earn an additional one (1) point.

If a team wins by more than a 7-goal spread, the official score will not be recorded with more than a 7-goal difference. (Examples: A 10-0 victory will be recorded as 7-0; a 10-1 victory will be recorded as 8-1).

GAME SHEETS

Electronic game sheets will be utilized for all OBHF Provincial events. Managers will be responsible for 'checking in' their players and staff at least 20 minutes prior to game at the sign-in table.

EARLY START UP

All teams MUST be available to play 15 minutes prior to scheduled start time.

MERCY RULE

- *All games (preliminary, round robin, semi-final and final) will have a mercy rule in play.
- *Should a team have a <u>five (5) goal lead in the third period only</u>, the clock will be running time until the deficit by the losing team has been lowered to four (4) goals.
- *The clock will stop following the 5th goal differential and then running time will commence once the ball Is dropped by the official.
- *Should a minor penalty be called during a run clock situation, it remains a 2-minute penalty, not a 3-minute penalty.

TIMEOUTS

- *Teams are allowed two (2) 30-second timeouts per game, but not in the same period. Any unused timeouts do not carry over to the final period or overtime.
- *Teams are allowed one (1) 30-second timeout per overtime (OT) period.

UNIFORMS

- *Each team must carry one (1) set of long-sleeved jerseys.
- *It is the responsibility of the designated **HOME** team to change in case of any colour conflicts.

All uniforms must be of matching jerseys (numbers and logos included). Pants/shorts must be of the same base colour. Any player not in proper uniform must retire to the dressing room.

Note: A set of same base colour jerseys, but not matching, is <u>NOT</u> acceptable.

The non-offending team may ask the officials to send the player to the dressing room should they not have a matching jersey.

TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURES

- 1. Most Points
- 2. Most Wins
- 3. If two (2) teams tied, winner between tied teams when they played head-to-head. Does not apply if more than two (2) teams are tied.
- 4. Percentage as calculated by dividing team's total "Goals For" by the SUM of the team's "Goals For" and "Goals Against". **TGF** / (**GF+GA**) = %
- 5. Goal Differential (plus or minus)
- 6. Most Goals For
- 7. Least Goals Against
- 8. First goal scored (period, time) in preliminary/round robin
- 9. Fewest Penalty Minutes
- 10. Coin Toss

Follow tie-breaking rules in order.

Once a tie-breaking rule has been used or is not applicable, it cannot be used again.

ELIMINATION, QUARTER-FINAL, SEMI-FINAL AND FINAL GAMES

Three (3) 10-minute stop time periods in length.

If tied following the three (3) 10-minute stop time periods, a 10-minute sudden victory overtime will occur. Teams **DO NOT** change ends. If still tied following the 10-minute sudden victory overtime period, a five (5) player shoot out will occur.

A player serving a penalty following the overtime period will be deemed ineligible for the shoot out and must remain in the penalty box.

The "Home" team designated on the game sheet will choose to shoot first or second.

Five shooters from each team will shoot. The highest overall score from the five shooters wins. If tied after the five shooters, the shoot out will continue with sudden victory one shooter at a time. Teams must exhaust their roster before a player may shoot a 2nd time. Once the team has exhausted their full roster, the other team may commence shooting a 2nd time.

TEAM PERFORMANCE

Any actions by players, coaches, team affiliates or followers that are detrimental to the sport will not be tolerated. Such behaviour by those responsible may result in fines or administrative recourse through suspension, up to an including **removal from all facilities**.

MANDATORY EQUIPMENT

All teams are reminded that CBHA policy regarding equipment will be strictly enforced.

Players MUST wear:

- *CSA approved helmet
- *Protective ice hockey gloves are mandatory. The use of palm-less hockey gloves are prohibited.
- *Identical matching jersey with same base-coloured pants/shorts.

Goalkeepers MUST wear:

- *CSA approved helmet and cage (no "CATS EYE" facial protection)
- *CSA approved catcher, blocker, pads, chest protector and hockey pants
- *Identical matching jersey or same base-coloured jersey
 - **Shin pads are MANDATORY for all OBHF Tournaments**
- *Shin pads made for ball hockey, and 'soccer-style' shin guards, are permitted and no longer require to be covered.
- *Hockey Sticks any hockey stick constructed for retail purposes (ie. One piece, aluminum with replacement blades, or wooden hockey sticks)
- *Blade Protectors of any form (picture for reference), are NOT permitted.



*In adult games, J-clips and visor clips or frames without the visor attached, are NOT permitted and must be removed or the visor re-inserted



PENALTIES

*Any player that receives three (3) penalties in a game will be ejected. (NOTE: Four (4) minute minors for stick infractions will only be counted as one infraction towards game ejection.)

SUSPENSIONS

Game Misconducts, Gross Misconducts or Match Penalties: games to be served in perpetuity at Provincials and/or National events. Further discipline **MAY** result at the local level as determined by the OBHF.

HANDSHAKES

Teams will shake hands before each game.

STANDINGS & SOCIAL MEDIA

Scores/Standings will be available at www.ggts.ca and www.ontarioballhockeyfederation.ca Paper result boards and scores will be available at headquarters.

EVENT MERCHANDISE

Will be available at this event.

DEFAULTS

- *Any team defaulting a game will have all of its registered players suspended from OBHF and CBHA tournaments for one year.
- *A default will automatically disqualify the team from the event.
- *In an instance where a team defaults a game, all games against that team will be recorded as a 7-0 victory for the non-offending team.

PROTESTS/APPEALS PROCESS

The OBHF is the governing body of recreational and competitive men's, minors and women's ball hockey in the Province of Ontario and aligns with the Canadian Ball Hockey Association (CBHA) best practices.

The appeal application form <u>must be submitted no later than 60 (sixty) minutes</u> after the completion of the game in question. That time will be determined by the electronic game sheet time stamp.

The non-refundable application fee is \$100 for a written/reviewed appeal with no hearing and a decision to be rendered via email.

There is a fee of \$200 for an in-person or teleconference hearing (cash, e-transfer or credit card) and must be received with the Application Form. This fee will cover costs associated with the review panel (administrative fees, compensation for their time, fuel, etc) and will **NOT** be refunded, regardless of the decision.

The one exception is that there will be no appeal fee if it is found that there was a misapplication of the rules in question. The Federation will review the incident and apply the correct rule associated with the infraction with cost to the player/team in question.

U10 DIVISION

Six (6) teams.
Two (2) pools of three (3) teams each.

Teams will play two (2) games within pool and one (1) cross-over game. 2nd and 3rd place teams in pools will play in quarter-finals; 1st place teams in pools advance to semi-finals

Winners of quarter-finals advance to semi-finals.
Winners of semi-finals advance to final.
Losers of semi-finals advance to consolation.

U12 DIVISION

Seven (7) teams.

Teams will play two (2) games against different teams then be ranked 1-7.

6th and 7th ranked teams will play Elimination Game.

2nd-5th ranked teams will play in quarter-finals.

1st ranked team, winner of Elimination Game and winners of quarter-finals advance to semi-finals.

Winners of semi-finals advance to consolation.

Losers of semi-finals advance to consolation.

U14 DIVISION

Five (5) teams.

Teams will play round robin.

Top four (4) teams advance to semi-finals.

Winners of semi-finals advance to final.

Losers of semi-finals advance to consolation.

U16 DIVISION

Five (5) teams.

Teams will play round robin.

Top four (4) teams advance to semi-finals.

Winners of semi-finals advance to final.

Losers of semi-finals advance to consolation.

ATTENTION: Parents, Players and Bench Staff

ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY FOR ALL MINOR EVENTS (under 18)

In order to maintain a safe and fun environment for all participants, the Zero Tolerance Policy will be applied.

- * All teams must have a coach of 21+ years of age on the bench for each game.
- * A single punch to the head during play, or after any whistle, will result in a 4-minute penalty.
- * A fight shall result in an immediate suspension and an OBHF review of the incident. If an instigator or aggressor is evident, the suspension may be elevated to an immediate expulsion from all OBHF events for future years. In all other cases, the OBHF has the right to determine the length of the suspension, which may include expulsion depending on the circumstances surrounding the incident.
 - * Verbal taunting of an opponent, or their spectators, is an automatic 10-minute misconduct.
- * Teams are expected to maintain control of their spectators. Failure to do so may result in the banning of their spectators for future games, and/or may result in the removal of the team from the event.
